
Haflingers are an Austrian breed.

Belgians are heavy draft horses developed in Belgium and is one of the strongest breeds of horse. After WWII, European breeders focused on breeding thicker bodied and heavier Belgians while Americans focused on lighter and taller Belgians, resulting in two distinct versions of the breed developing.

My full name is That's Just Smokey, but they call me TeeJay. I came to the Riding Center in June 2014 together with Hank. I was trained to pull a cart and competed in that before I came here. I am a great horse for learning to groom, lead, or ride!



Paint Horses are an offshoot of Quarter Horses, defined by their pinto coloring. Horses like TeeJay who do not have the defining color pattern can still be registered if their bloodlines contain registered Paint Horses.
