• Started in 2009 as a response to the Emerald ash borer and was then known as Tree Corps



• Recently changed names as we've begun growing herbaceous plants

• Reforestation efforts in Conservation Areas such as Medlar Cons Area and in various parks

#### Main tasks you'll typically be working on:


- Check tree, shrub, and herbaceous flats assessing need for up-potting, general health, and up-potting as needed

Herbaceous species grown in 2024







